The Redwood's year-long "Women on the Move" is a leadership program for women who have experienced violence. It is designed to support personal growth and goal development. It encourages women to become advocates in the community, working to end the kind of abuse they've survived.

Women participate in self-assessment to uncover their strengths. They acknowledge the trauma they continue to experience as the result of violence. And they develop communication skills including public speaking, presentation delivery, and group facilitation, all of which enhance their opportunities for employment.

This year, The Redwood celebrated the graduation of the 9th "Women on the Move" class! Congratulations to the graduates!

Dear Friends,

This year marks the 25th anniversary since The Redwood opened its doors to serve women and children fleeing abuse. The occasion is bittersweet. I would have hoped that after 25 years, our community would be further along on the journey to end gender-based violence. Perhaps, The Redwood would have to shut down due to lack of "business"! But we are not there — yet. In fact, in just the first 11 weeks of 2018, 10 women in the GTA were lost to femicide, along with 5 family members.

Still, even in the face of such heart-breaking tragedy, we will not be discouraged! I certainly know from your support that YOU are not discouraged! And so, as we enter the second 25 years of The Redwood's journey, I believe it is important to acknowledge the incredible efforts that so many of you have put into supporting vulnerable women and children, since 1993.

I am humbled by the **resolve of the community:** the founders and friends who literally built The Redwood shelter with their own hands, and the board members and volunteers who have kept its services growing.

I am grateful for the **kindness of donors:** the thousands of individuals, businesses, faith groups, schools, service clubs, foundations, and corporations that have contributed financial gifts to support the women and children who seek refuge at The Redwood.

I am inspired by the **passion of our staff** who bear witness to terrible pain and work so hard to help women and children heal.


I am in awe of the **courage of women** who risk so much to come to The Redwood, hoping to build better lives for themselves and their children.
